#### **Background:**

Compass is an interagency partnership between USAID Bangladesh and the United States Forest Service, International Programs (USFS/IP). It works with USAID Bangladesh to strengthen institutions and communities' capacity to manage natural resources and improve livelihoods in Bangladesh through evidence-based scientific technical exchange. USFS/IP implements the Compass Program to address natural resource management challenges in Bangladesh by establishing a youth conservation corps, strengthening community capacity, and promoting public participation, assisting the Bangladesh Forest Department (BFD) with technical assistance, and strengthening academic and research institutions' capacity in natural resource management and resilience. Compass works throughout the country, with a particular emphasis on the Bandarban, Cox's Bazar, and Dhaka districts. Currently, Compass has planned to conduct overall stocktaking following the completion of the project period and to utilize the findings in its final report. Compass will engage the junior consultants to get their support in qualitative data transcribing and analysis.

- One-on-one in-person and/or telephonic interviews with the selected stakeholders.
- Pause and Reflect events, After Action Reviews, FGDs.
- Data processing, analysis, and report writing.

- Complete data collection from the sampled respondents.
- Submit transcriptions to the Compass MEL Manager.
- Submit the summary of qualitative data by categories or contents.
